Generally Accepted Classes of Business

Logging

The process of cutting, processing and moving trees/logs to a location for transport. This includes skidding, on-site processing and loading of trees and/or logs onto trucks or skeleton cars.

Log road construction

The action of building roads directly related to the management or harvesting of timber. This includes maintaining logging roads as well as the original road construction.

Chipping

The process of debarking and converting the feedstock to chips while on logging sites.

Log/chip hauling

Using a special truck, trailer or van to load, unload and transport logs and/or chips.

Lumber Haulers (only available in the northwest)

The transportation of finished lumber from one location to another.

Ineligible Classes

- Lumber and wood products manufacturing

INCIDENTALS

We will look at incidental operations that are less than 25% outside of the core eligible classes.

MINIMUM INFORMATION NEEDED TO PROVIDE A QUOTE

- 3 years in operation or equivalent industry experience
- ACORD application along with the Victor supplemental application and multiple named insured form
- 4 years of loss runs
